## **Cathedral Schools Trust: Trinity Academy**

We are delighted to let you know that we now have a confirmed site for Cathedral Schools Trust's new secondary school. A brand new school, to be called CST Trinity Academy, will be built on land adjoining Stoke Park Primary School, located on Romney Avenue in north Bristol. The new school will help to meet the increased demand for secondary school places in Bristol and is planned to open for Year 7 students in September 2019, growing year on year with an eventual capacity of 1220 students (180 students per year group as well as sixth-form provision).



CST Trinity Academy will have a very close relationship with Bristol Cathedral Choir School (BCCS) and the primary schools that are part of CST. The trust will work closely with Bristol City Council to deliver the new school, as well as primary and secondary school leaders, prospective families and community groups across Bristol.

#### **Equalities Group**

The Equalities Group has already been working hard since September to continue to promote equality and celebrate diversity here at BCCS. We decided to change the format a little this year, and focus on raising awareness of a different issue each month. In September we discussed Hate Crime in general and students prepared a tutor-time activity on this. In October, to celebrate Black History Month, the historian Edson Burton delivered an assembly in the cathedral, highlighting Black History specifically in Bristol, and the recent achievements of people such as our Mayor Marvin Rees, and those on the music scene such as ex-student Joel Douglas.

In November, the group wanted to highlight the work of Young Carers at BCCS and produced another tutor time activity on this, and in December they delivered a fantastic assembly on Learning Difficulties, also speaking about their own experiences with dyslexia and ADHD, which was extremely powerful. So far in 2018, they have been looking at issues surrounding Children in Care in January, LGBTQ+ equality in February, and Gender equality. Mental Health issues will be considered in April and May. Some students also recently attended a fantastic 'Equality of Voice' conference at City Hall, which was organised by Bristol Unity Youth Forum and involved an evening of speeches and presentations, videos, poems, performances and debates around issues facing Black and Minority Ethnic, and Refugee and Asylum-Seeking students. It was great to see students getting involved in the discussions, and also signing up to join the Unity Youth Forum in the future.

Mr Callaghan and I would also like to again thank the other members of the Stand Up 4 Diversity Group who delivered a fantastic assembly on Racist Language towards the end of last year.
