BCCS Careers Events/Opportunities:

Work Experience – Work Experience has now been launched to Year 10, Year 11 and Year 12 students. The block WEX block placements will take place between 15th - 19th June for Year 10 and 22nd June - 3rd July for Year 11. Post 16 students can complete Work Experience placements at any time across the year subject to authorisation from the 6th Form leadership team. Careers Personal Guidance – Personal Guidance meetings have now started. All Year 11 students will be offered a one to one meeting with our Careers Advisors, Ms Jenkinson. The two hour session will provide all students with the opportunity to learn about the job and career opportunities available, and to consider how their personal strengths and preferences may fit with different career paths.
