BCCS Employability – If you have selected the *Employability Pathway* or would just like to improve your Employability Skills to support your next steps there are a number of excellent short courses which can be found on the Employability Google classroom [here](#) (code g3yuh4n). Please do take a look and sign up for those of particular interest (this information can also be found on the BCCS Futures webpage [here](#)).

Work Experience – I would like to thank all Yr 10/11/12 students as well as parents/carers for their dedicated efforts in finding WEX placements this year - in both Yr 10 and Yr 11 over 85% of students have already secured placements. Due to the unprecedented situation we all face as a result of Coronavirus (COVID 19) the BCCS WEX programme for this year is now looking uncertain. A decision on whether WEX can be completed will be taken by Head Teacher, Mr P Atkins, and communicated to parents/carers well in advance of the allocated WEX weeks (Yr 10 15th-19th June and Yr 11 22nd June - 3rd July 2020). In the meantime please could I request that, due to the pressures employers may find themselves under currently, students without a WEX placement hold off on seeking new opportunities. Similarly for those who have already secured a placement, unless contacted directly, please avoid communication with employers regarding WEX placements until further information has been issued from BCCS.

If students are still interested in completing WEX (highly desired by employers!) then please take a look at the [Experience Programme](#) from Speakers for Schools which offers Virtual WEX – this is a new programme so the current offer may be limited but definitely worth a look!

Destinations (College/6th Form/University) – All Yr 11 and Yr 13 students should have a conditional destination for September 2020. If you are still unsure about next steps or need support in making decisions regarding a preferred route please get in touch. Transition work for both University and Level 3 providers should now be available – if you have not already received this please request details for a fully prepared September start.

Careers Personal Guidance (Yr12/13) – There are a limited number of PG meetings available with the schools Careers Adviser. If you have not already had a meeting and would like to request a 'virtual meeting' please contact Ms D Smith to schedule an appointment.

GROFAR, student Careers Portfolio – All students in Years 7-11 should now have registered for the Careers software Grofar. This is an online Careers portfolio which allows students to record and track all careers activities completed whilst at BCCS.
