Careers Personal Guidance – Personal Guidance meetings will commence on **Tuesday 10th November**. All Year 11 students will be offered a meeting with our Level 6 qualified Careers Advisors, Ms Jenkinson. Students will have an opportunity to discuss future careers, local labour market information and next steps. The schedule of meetings as well as support resources will be available from Tutors after half term. Post 16 students will be offered meetings with Ms Jenkinson in January on completion of the Year 11 sessions.

Envision Mentoring – I am delighted to announce that we have secured a nine week mentoring programme through the support of Envision. Up to 13 Year 10 students will be invited to take part in the mentoring programme focussed on communication, team-working and determination. Students will receive seven face to face skills development and two virtual mentoring sessions from local employers, Hargreaves Lansdown. The programme will start in November.

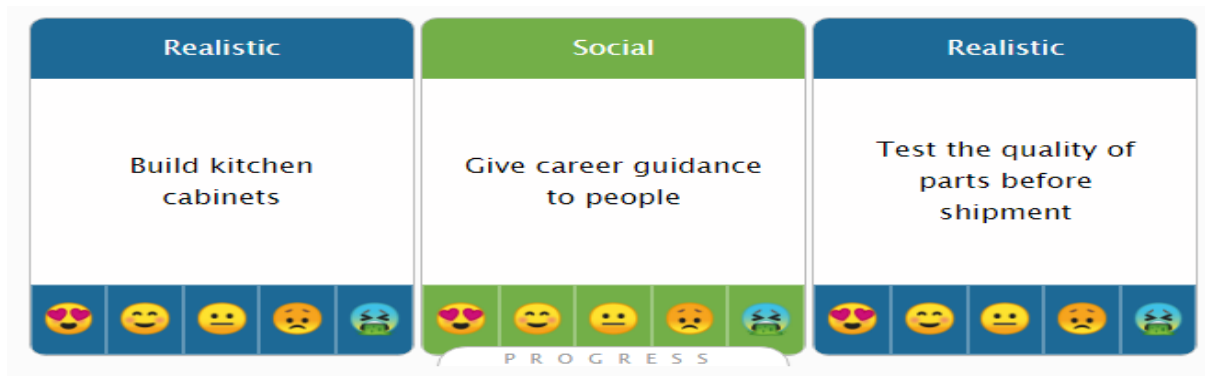

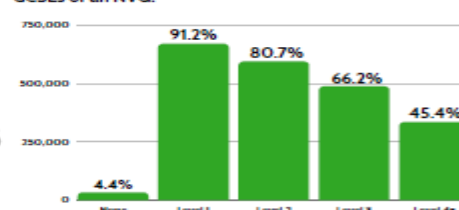
