

## Updated guidance: Coronavirus (COVID-19): school admission appeals Effective 24th April 2020 to 30th September 2021

- Appeal panels will not need to be held in person.
- There will be flexibility for panel hearings to take place either in person, by telephone, video conference or through a paper-based appeal where all parties can make representations in writing.
- The rules are relaxed with regard to what happens if one of the 3 panel members withdraws (temporarily or permanently) to make it permissible for the panel to continue with and conclude the appeal as a panel of 2
- The deadlines relating to appeals for the time that the new regulations are in force are amended.
- Appellants will be given at least 28 calendar days' written notice of a new appeal deadline.
- and at least 14 calendar days' written notice of an appeal hearing (although appellants can waive their right to this).
- All deadlines for the hearing of appeals must be as soon as reasonably practicable.
- Clerking duties for admission appeals will not be removed. Clerks carry out a key role
  in relation to appeal hearings and provide advice on admissions law as well as
  keeping an accurate record of proceedings.
