
Reports

Homework & revisiting learning






Homework is an opportunity to practice skills and extend your learning. It builds responsibility, confidence and good working habits.

Year 10


Teachers refer students for EAA via external bodies.







Please note all communication regarding WEX should be directed to Ms Keir who is leading on WEX co-ordination this year.



Class activity—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers.







Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.


