




## Reports

Homework & revisiting learning






Homework is an opportunity to practise skills and extend your learning. It builds responsibility, confidence and good working habits.







#### **BCCS Careers Events/Opportunities:**


Work Experience — Year 10/11 the full requirements for Work Experience will be shared during assembly this term. The formal WEX block placements will take place for Year 10 between 15%—15%—June and for Year 11 between 22%—26% June and/or 25% June -3% July. Post 16 Work Experience will be fully explained during Advice & Guidance but students have flexibility to complete placements throughout the year. Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent.

**Upcoming work**—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails).

**Class activity**—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers.

Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.



### The ART of revision

- A= active revision is the most effective.
- R= repetition is important for forming long-term memories.
- T= **testing** of knowledge is just as important as trying to learn it.



## Is the revision they are doing helpful?

#### **Active Revision**

- Flash cards
- Mind maps
- Dual coding linking key terms to pictures
- Past papers/exam questions



#### **Passive Revision**

- Rereading notes or textbooks
- Rewriting notes
- Highlighting

- Encourage your child to use the school library after school. It is open and staffed until 4.30pm each day.
